Bugbrooke

During the month of June, I have been dealing with an ongoing situation where reports have come in around lone females being followed round the village of Bugbrooke with some earlier incidents being also reported in Nether Heyford.

While I imagine that was a frightening situation for the women involved, its believed to not been as first reported. We have been working with one of the women involved ensuring she felt safe in the community but also with the other party who is receiving help from necessary departments. This is currently ongoing.

I have visited an elderly male in the community who believed he had been the victim of a burglary due to misplacing some items. I attended with a colleague, and we made sure that he was able to lock his doors and windows and had the necessary keys. Safeguarding has been completed, and he has a great support network in the village who have been helping him continue to live independently.

At the end of the Campion school year, some students decided it would be a good idea to dispose of some schoolbooks by setting them on fire. Their chosen place to do this was the MUGA on the field, not a great location and even more foolishly they left their names in the books so evidentially this was an easy win! Thankfully not damage was done, and with help from Campion, the parents were called and cleaning up was completed by said students.

I also this month delivered the Blue butterfly presentation which is where we talk to primary school pupils about how sometimes you might be in a situation where you get butterflies in your tummy when an adult has asked you to keep a secret which might not be a good one, or how you see something at home that gives you that feeling and how best to release the butterflies by talking to a trusted adult.

I attended the Bugbrooke fete and had a great time engaging with young people from the village. Great turnout and great chance to engage with the community.

This month I also did a talk with the Guides. Talked about personal safety and how to look after yourself. We then opened the floor for questions, and my favourite of the night would be "If you went to the zoo and monkeys stole your number plate would you be arrested on the way home for not having a number plate". I love the imagination of kids!

This month I have also been dealing with 3 neighbour disputes and a sharing of indecent images situation between 3 minors.

Nether Heyford

I am aware that the EVRI lorry situation has continued. I understand there has been some frustration in terms of what appears to be a lack of action and that recently a lorry got stuck in someone's driveway. The driver of this vehicle has been issued with a NIP (notice of intended prosecution) and will be receiving a penalty once they have responded to this notice. I have spoken to the resident involved in this most recent incident to ensure there is no damage and to let them know about the intended prosecution. Warning letters have also been sent to the 3 companies who have also been pictured as they have not had the warning that EVRI have had. They have been made aware that future incidents will result in NIP's being sent. I would like to thank the community for their continued support with the photos. I will ensure that you receive an update on the prosecution.

I have carried out some patrols in the school area due to reports of double yellow line parking. Warning letters were sent.

I have attended the bowls club and the football club for routine patrols. I also attended the fete which was a great engagement opportunity and managing to dodge the rain was even better!

Harpole

In the month of June, I managed to get the fly tipped caravan removed from Larkhall lane with a quick turnaround. This is one of the only routes out of the village so it's important it remained clear and safe for residents.

I have been assisting a resident who had been involved in an incident some years back but hadn't heard from the officer with an update. They were not good with tech, so I assisted in getting the update they needed which gave them peace of mind to move forward.

I have been to the Brownies meeting in the village and met with the fantastic young people and the leaders who were happy to engage with myself and my colleagues from CID.

There have been some reported issues around a quad bike in the village, and I have spoken to the person who was believed to be involved and given words of advice around this.

Issues have been reported around the bowls club and the young people involved have been identified and words of advice will be issued.

A suspicious vehicle was reported to me which had been outside a property for some weeks, this was allocated to me and on my way there it was removed. Must have known I was coming! I have also issued yellow warning notes to several cars parking on pavements and blocking junctions.
